Turn slight right onto Corliss Ave. North.  
Turn slight right onto Northgate Way, under the freeway overpass.  
At the light, turn right onto 1st Avenue NE.  
Turn left at the second light (100th Ave NE).  
Turn right into the Northgate Executive Center, across from the  
Northgate bus terminal/park 'n ride. Park in the parking lot to your left.  
Take the east stairs between the two buildings to Suite 225.

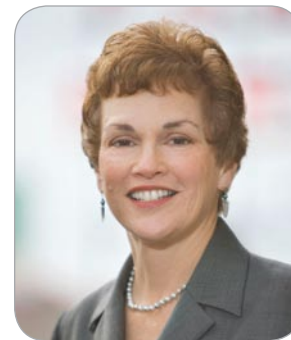
